## Jackie Tuppen Speaking on **'COGS Club: A Club for People** *with Mild Dementia'* Tuesday October 11th 4.15pm-5.30pm Ng03, Newton

This session is <u>free of charge</u> &open to anyone; all are welcome including professionals, carers, people with dementia or anyone else with an interest.

Cognitive Stimulation Therapy (CST) is an evidence based group programme of activity and stimulation grounded in person centred care. It is recommended in the NICE Guidelines (2006) as the only non-drug related treatment for memory problems. The programme is normally run as a two hour session, twice a week, over seven weeks.

COGS Clubs are based on & run in the same structured way as a CST session but instead of two hours a COGS Club offers a day of activity, stimulation, music and fun for a person with mild dementia.

It provides the opportunity for them to recall or develop new skills in activities & to facilitate the transfer of these skills to activities at home. It also provides the family/carer/significant other with a day's respite. Fun is a key component to the day & we have found that laughter dissolves distressing emotions (you can't feel anxious, angry, or sad when you're laughing). It appears to help members relax & reduces stress whilst enabling us all to stay focused and accomplish more.

The DSDCse are very pleased to welcome Admiral Nurse Jackie Tuppen, founder of the club, to speak about the work being done & the benefits to the participants.
