Dementia is not visible. There are no physical signs. Everything can look quite normal. But for a person with dementia, familiar places can suddenly feel strange. Finding right words to say can be difficult and everyday objects can appear as something new and untested.

How can the experience of dementia be understood by others?

Experiencing dementia is a visual and performance installation that explores and attempts to share part of the experience of living with dementia. This is a thought provoking, interactive experience for all ages.

This installation has been produced by Bright Shadow performance company in collaboration with people with dementia from Trinity Resource Centre and young volunteers from The Children's Society.
